# Update from Parish Pastoral Council Chairperson – Gerard Gallagher

2020 has been a particularly challenging year for our Parish. Yet it has been impressive how people adapted and adjusted to all the changes we had to make. We have had a significant amount of time without public Mass. We have had to implement Covid-19 protocols. Whilst the physical environment of our Church has been modified, it has been amazing to see how parishioners and the Parish Pastoral Council responded.

I would like to say a word of appreciation to our older parishioners who had to stay at home for a lengthy spell. Neighbours and parishioners rallied and supported each other. A year ago, we installed a Webcam in the Parish and we were unsure of how it would be received or used. It has become a valuable asset and is used daily by many to participate at Mass online.

It has also been used for funerals, weddings and First Communion. All these moments went ahead with restricted numbers. Sunday Mass has continued with the core support of volunteers also. The choir has been reduced to a cantor/soloist per Mass and this has been difficult for choir members.

In the Spring all the priests from the Parish came out for the day and with members of the Parish Pastoral Council they visited many of our older parishioners, where possible at the gates of their houses.

Special thanks to the work of John Valentine and Cyril Mongey who provided key support on this project. The restoration of daily Mass – via webcam has been an immense support to people. Thanks to Fr Jackie and Harry Goff for committing to this on a daily basis. Also the work of Monica Sheehan who has helped with the Sacristy duties and support from Patricia Daly also has to be acknowledged.

During this Advent period in the lead up to Christmas we are pleased now that public Mass with a congregation can now take place. Please read our Christmas section. Christmas will be celebrated, but there will be slight changes to this experience, so plan and prepare.

Finally a word of thanks to all the Parish Pastoral Council and other Parish volunteers who really did work hard over the past year. We also remember Tom Kenny a member of our Parish Finance Committee who died during the year.

#### **Christmas Checklist**

It is important to note that the capacity of the Church is significantly reduced to 31 seating positions and a capacity of 50.

- Priority will be given to the older parishioners.
- We will not have a booking or first come basis but stewards will try to assist everyone.
- Some may choose to attend but stay outside where we have outdoor sound and an outdoor crib; please dress accordingly, wrap up, stay in your family pod, social distance.
- Mask wearing is now mandatory inside. Please ensure it is worn correctly above nose etc.
- ♦ Sanitiser is available at all doors, you must use this on entry − follow the one-way system.
- We have added two new times to accommodate as many as we can during Christmas.
- Parishioners are asked not to congregate after Mass both inside and outside of Church.

In previous years, coordinating the liturgy rosters for Eucharistic Ministers and Readers was a task required just once a year- but as we all well know, this year is not like previous years. Our Mass at St Peter's in 2020 has been a challenging time with multiple occurrences of being 'open', 'closed', 'web-cam only', and finally now 'open again' for the season of Advent and Christmas. The use of hand-sanitisers, facemasks, and ribbons cordoning off of the benches in the Church have become an all too familiar scene of worship and ministry.

With so much change, we rely heavily on what endures. Once again, that remains the dedication and flexibility of St Peter's Eucharistic Ministers and Readers. The spirit of teamwork has been clearly evident throughout the year as all our volunteers grappled with the challenge of community involvement versus personal safety. We wish to thank everyone in the choices they have made throughout the year to keep safe and for their on-going dedication to the Parish.

We strongly encourage the faithful to *keep Christ at the centre* of Christmas this year. Clearly it will be impossible for our usual large congregations to assemble for Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. We wish to remind Catholics that the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days remains suspended during the pandemic. But Christmas is about more than just one day. Families are welcome to attend Mass at some point during the twelve days from Christmas Eve to Epiphany. Christmas Masses will also be widely available over webcam and we strongly encourage families to "tune in" from the "domestic churches" of their living rooms and join with those who are gathering in their local churches in welcoming the birth of the Christ-child. We celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation for Two Mile House N.S. on the 29<sup>th</sup> February 2020; this was also the day that the first case of Covid 19 in Ireland was confirmed. Little did we know how much our lives would change when we were celebrating on that day! On the 1<sup>st</sup> March Killashee N.S. celebrated their Confirmation. We were very fortunate that both schools got to celebrate and have a traditional ceremony. We would like to thank the parents of the First Communion who helped to prepare the church and also Maeve Jacob for the beautiful flower arrangements.

Unfortunately, the First Holy Communion sacrament had to be postponed from its original May date. Thankfully, the children had celebrated their First Penance earlier in the year. We marked the day that the First Communion was to take place, on the 16<sup>th</sup>May, with a virtual prayer service. We are very grateful to Caitriona Howley for printing all the photos of the children and helping with the readings. We also thank Ms. Imy O'Donovan, the Second class teacher from Two Mile House N.S. and the parent volunteer, Mairsile Kehoe from Killashee N.S. for their help with the ceremony

The First Holy Communion ceremonies had to be changed to take account of the public health restrictions, but we finally got to celebrate the sacrament on Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> September. There were four

ceremonies; two for each school. We would like to thank all who helped with these ceremonies; there was a team of people involved, from both schools and the Parish; it was down to them that everything went off so well. We were all relieved that the children got to celebrate such an important day in their lives.

At this stage we do not know what celebrating the sacraments of First Penance, First Holy Communion and Confirmation will be like in 2021, but the schools and parishes will work together to ensure that the children get to receive the sacraments. We are all very disappointed that we can't have the usual preparation Masses, but hopefully the children will still get to attend Mass during Level 3 and lower. We also invite the children to the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve at 6pm.

We would like to thank the principals and staff of both schools for their help with both First Holy Communion and Confirmation preparation and the ceremonies. In addition, we would like to thank the Parish volunteers that helped with the four First Holy Communion ceremonies:
