

February 11th, World Day of the Sick and the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes

Thursday, February 11th, is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for us to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this day, people around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick. Faith organisations mark this day especially, to provide the sick with medicines, food and spiritual guidance. Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. This year's theme is : *"You have but one teacher and you are all brothers" (Mt 23:8). A trust-based relationship to guide care for the sick.*

"The celebration of the XXIX World Day of the Sick on 11 February 2021, the liturgical memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lourdes, is an opportunity to devote special attention to the sick and to those who provide them with assistance and care both in healthcare institutions and within families and communities. We think in particular of those who have suffered, and continue to suffer, the effects of the worldwide coronavirus pandemic. To all, and especially to the poor and the marginalized, I express my spiritual closeness and assure them of the

Church's loving concern...To Mary, Mother of Mercy and Health of the Infirm, I entrust the sick, healthcare workers and all those who generously assist our suffering brothers and sisters. From the Grotto of Lourdes and her many other shrines throughout the world, may she sustain our faith and hope, and help us care for one another with fraternal love" (Pope Francis).
