World Day for Grandparents and Older People. 28th July 2024

Going back over the years, Grandparents and Older People were the silent minority. They were never really appreciated for the work and help they were to young families. But then through an inspiration that the Founder of the Catholic Grandparents Association had at Our Lady's Shrine in Walsingham, in 2001, the seed for the Catholic Grandparents Association was sown.

The mission of the Catholic Grandparents Association is: -

'to help Grandparents pass on the faith, to value and support them in that role and keep prayer at the heart of family life.'

Grandparents have gone into the schools to explain about the Rosary. They have given Rosary Beads to the children, Miraculous Medals, and Prayer Books. In 2022, Pope Francis announced that the last Sunday in July would be a Special Day of Prayer for Grandparents and Older People. He said he was one now himself and would like to be included.

Grandparents and Older People are now well respected and appreciated. It has been highlighted how important they are in minding grandchildren, bringing them to school, teaching them prayers and bringing them to Mass, bringing them into the Church during the day, showing them the Stations of the Cross, the stained glass windows, the statues and how to be reverent in the Church, and blessing them with Holy Water.
