how to grow and how to prepare to live forever in paradise.


The journey is based on the Holy Scriptures and the teachings of the great spiritual saints:

Thur 10th Oct 7.30pm	Peadar Tóibín TD, first elected to Dail Eireann for the Meath West constituency in 2011. In 2015, he founded the Irish Political Party, Aontú.	
Fri 11th Oct 7.30pm	Geraldine Mullan , will tell her deeply personal story of how faith, hope and love have carried her since her life changed dramatically in 2020. When her husband and two children died tragically.	
Sat 12th Oct 6pm	Bishop Donal Roche , native of Drimnagh. He has served in a number of parishes, also as a Chaplain and Teacher. Ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin in May this year and titular Bishop of Cell Ausaille, an ancient monastic site at nearby Killashee.


